

The Paw Paw Public Library District takes all kinds of books and DVD's. Unfortunately, we <u>do not</u> take encyclopedias or VHS tapes. Not sure if it's something we take, bring it in anyway.

Once you donate something to the library it becomes library property and it is up to the library employees to decide what becomes of the donation.

We do everything we can to find homes for donations. Not everything is salvageable and may end up in recycling. Books and DVD's we cannot use in our collection most likely will be sent to Thrift Books, an online book seller, to sell for the library. From these sales the library gets a percentage of the profit. Many children's/young adult books get put on our *Free Stuff* shelving unit. Some books go to

Goodwill, N.I.C.E, other libraries, or Half Price Books.

If you plan on bringing in more than a couple of boxes, please call ahead of time. Otherwise drop off when the library is open. If it's just a few items, you can put them in the book drop out front of the Community Center.




Cork O'Connor #20 Apostle's Cove William Kent Krueger




Kay Scarpetta #29 Sharp Force Patricia Cornwell

A newly unveiled Picasso, hidden for a century in a dusty French attic, is set to be auctioned at the prestigious House of Echelon. And




Be Dazzled Ryan La Sala




